



Governor's Safety Professional Award Application checklist

The **Governor's Safety Professional Award** is intended to recognize individuals, still active in the profession, that have dedicated their lives to the advancement of safety. This recognition is for the dedication that surpasses a "career" in safety, going outside of the workplace and looking to volunteer efforts of the individual in promoting the safety and health of all Alaskans.

The nominee must:

- be an Alaskan resident
- have been working in the field of Safety and Health in Alaska for 10 or more years
- have been in the field of Safety and Health for a minimum of 15 years
- be regarded by their peers as a true "Safety Professional"
- have made substantial contributions in the field of Safety and Health
- be an active volunteer in a non-profit in a safety-related capacity for a minimum of 2 years
- not have won this award in the last 5 years

This award was established by the State of Alaska to recognize recipients for their service and volunteerism to their profession, their community, and the State of Alaska in the field of Safety.

NOTE: If additional information or clarification is needed by the award committee, the applicant will be notified. The applicant will be disqualified if any of the data proves incorrect or the applicant is unresponsive.

Required

- Nominee's contact information
- Nominee's years of service to Alaska and years of service in safety and health
- Nominee's Volunteer Organization and years of volunteer service
- Description of why nominee is regarded as a true "Safety Professional."
- Description of the contributions and how the nominee has demonstrated ability in the field of Safety and Health.
- Summary of the voluntary service the nominee performed that demonstrates the advancement of safety and health in Alaska.
- Three (3) recommenders
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- Volunteer Organization Recommendation Letter
- Company Supervisor or Client Recommendation Letter
- Peer or Co-worker Recommendation Letter
