



## Governor's Safety Professional Award Application checklist

The **Governor's Safety Professional Award** is intended to recognize individuals, still active in the profession, that have dedicated their lives to the advancement of safety. This recognition is for the dedication that surpasses a "career" in safety, going outside of the workplace and looking to volunteer efforts of the individual in promoting the safety and health of all Alaskans.

The nominee must:

- Be a resident of Alaska.
- Have at least 5 years of experience working in the field of Safety and Health in Alaska.
- Have a minimum of 8 years of professional experience in Safety and Health overall.
- Be widely recognized by their peers as a committed and accomplished "Safety Professional."
- Demonstrate substantial contributions to the field of Safety and Health, with a clear and positive impact on the profession or community.
- Have actively participated in safety advocacy in Alaska for at least 2 years, through efforts such as volunteering with nonprofits, leading safety education initiatives, mentoring, or other safety-related contributions.
- Not have received this award in the past 5 years.

This award was established by the State of Alaska to recognize recipients for their service and volunteerism to their profession, their community, and the State of Alaska in the field of Safety.

**NOTE:** If additional information or clarification is needed by the award committee, the applicant will be notified. The applicant will be disqualified if any of the data proves incorrect or the applicant is unresponsive.

### Required

- Nominee's contact information
- Nominee's years of service to Alaska and years of service in safety and health
- Nominee's Volunteer Organization and years of volunteer service
- Description of why nominee is regarded as a true "Safety Professional."
- Description of the contributions and how the nominee has demonstrated ability in the field of Safety and Health.
- Summary of the voluntary service the nominee performed that demonstrates the advancement of

safety and health in Alaska.

- Volunteer Organization Recommendation Letter
- Company Supervisor or Client Recommendation Letter
- Peer or Co-worker Recommendation Letter
